AIDS, Orphans and Vulnerable Children – BFC is prayerfully taking steps to minister in partnership with the Swazi Church on these two important areas surrounding the AIDS prevalence rate and orphaned or vulnerable children.

- **AIDS** – Church leaders in Swaziland agree that the education of pastoral couples is necessary before their congregations can understand the importance of abstinence and fidelity. Plans are underway to provide curriculum to help prepare pastoral couples for a nationwide Swazi Nazarene leadership conference that will take place in 2011. From this conference every district will come away with a strategic plan to implement and follow. We believe that the Lord can use the Swazi Nazarene church to lead the way in holiness living that transforms behavior.
- **ORPHANS AND VULNERABLE CHILDREN** – Nazarene Compassionate Ministries (NCM) is leading the way in Africa with Child Development Centres. These centres are located at Nazarene churches where they work with the 50 neediest children in their community. NCM is introducing this program in Swaziland. BFC is ready to help in the formation and sponsorship of these children as the program is established in Swaziland.
