### NAZARENE CLINICS THROUGHOUT SWAZILAND

After the GO team left Swaziland towards the beginning of September we were given the task of visiting all of the 17 Nazarene Clinics in Swaziland. The Church of the Nazarene has an incredible presence in such a small country. To be honest, visiting the clinics had its ups and downs. The government in Swaziland does not have enough money right now and times are hard. Lots of people no longer have money for transportation to the hospitals and as a result the rural clinics have a lot of pressure to provide for their communities. Some of the clinics we visited were built in the 1940's and were falling apart. There were lots of cracks in their foundation due to years of use. The oldest clinic we saw was built in 1936 and was in desperate need of repair.

Since we visited the clinics I have been praying for their needs. I know that I am only one person with limited resources, but I serve a God whose resources are abundant. Please pray with us for the needs of the clinics in Swaziland and the nurse's who are working hard with limited resources.

### COMMUNITY GARDEN

Another project that we've been working on is the Community Vegetable Garden at Nkiliji. BFC has sponsored this garden since August 2009 in partnership with the HIV/AIDS Task Force and the co-op from Nkiliji. BFC's sponsorship provided the fencing of the garden, tilling of the land, and the seed for their first crop. The people from the community can come and work in the garden and use a portion of the food for themselves. Anything that is left over is sold at the market and the proceeds are distributed among the co-op members.

The problem is that Nkiliji is in a relatively hilly part of Swaziland and the garden is located on the slope of one of these hills. When the heavy rains come, the plants at the top of the hill don't get enough water and those at the bottom get too much. We visited the garden and found that the co-op members were doing the best they could with their very limited resources. They have next to no gardening or farming tools but have still managed to level out small sections of the garden and are growing as much as possible. We are hoping to get these people some help in the near future as they are doing an amazing job with what they've been given. We definitely need your prayers as we work out ways to help these people work towards a flourishing and productive garden.

### NTONDOZI CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

As a great praise, I would like to let everyone know that the kitchen at Ntondozi is finished! The men of the community have been working tirelessly to finish out the final details so the cook can move in and start preparing meals. This project, which was started as just a kitchen, has been finished as a secure storeroom, office for the church secretary, and kitchen! It has been amazing to see the support from the community as all kinds of tools, supplies, and labor have been donated to see this project through. Thank you for all your prayers and support that have made this amazing project possible. It could not have been accomplished without you!
